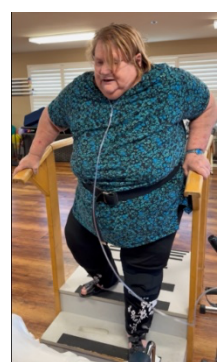
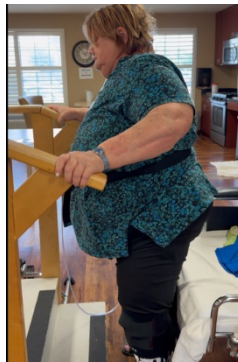
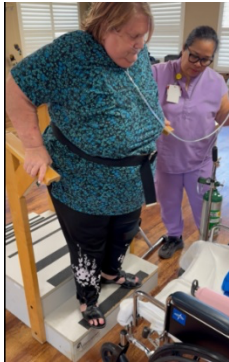


## OUTCOMES MATTER

**Length of Stay:** 31 days



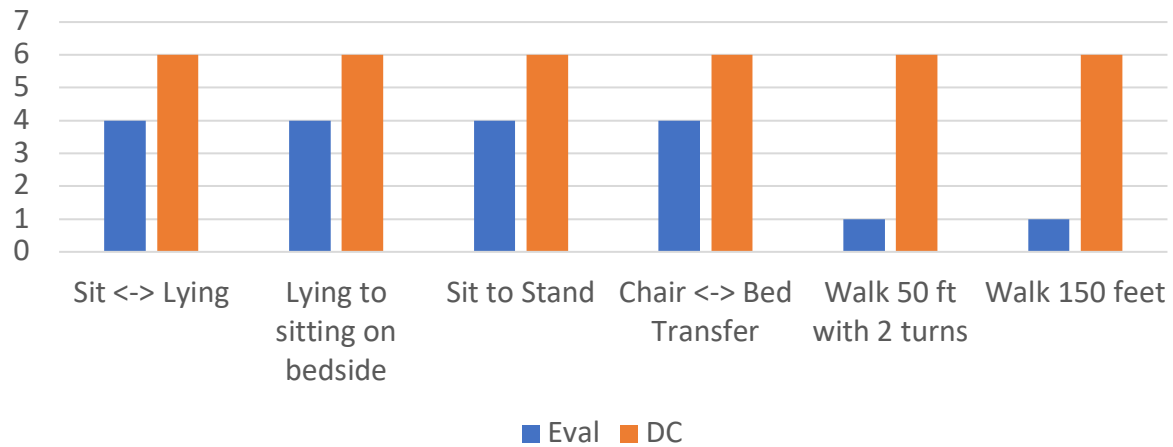
### **Background:**

On a mission to walking and stairs is what Joy wants. With her father as the head of the missionary group, Joy travelled far and wide and has lived for 13 years in the Philippines helping people realized their true purpose in life. Patricia Wyatt, but she prefers to be called Joy, is a 66 year old female patient who came to Park Manor Cypress Station for therapy due to deficits in functional mobility secondary to hospitalization with history of morbid obesity, sciatica, solitary kidney, presenting with back pain and difficulty urinating with acute kidney infection likely due to dehydration and her recent fall. During her initial evaluation, Joy needs moderate assistance with her activities of daily living and she needs minimal assistance with her bed mobility and transfers. Joy was not able to walk during her evaluation due to pain 10/10. She lives with her sister and brother in-law in a trailer with 7 standard steps.

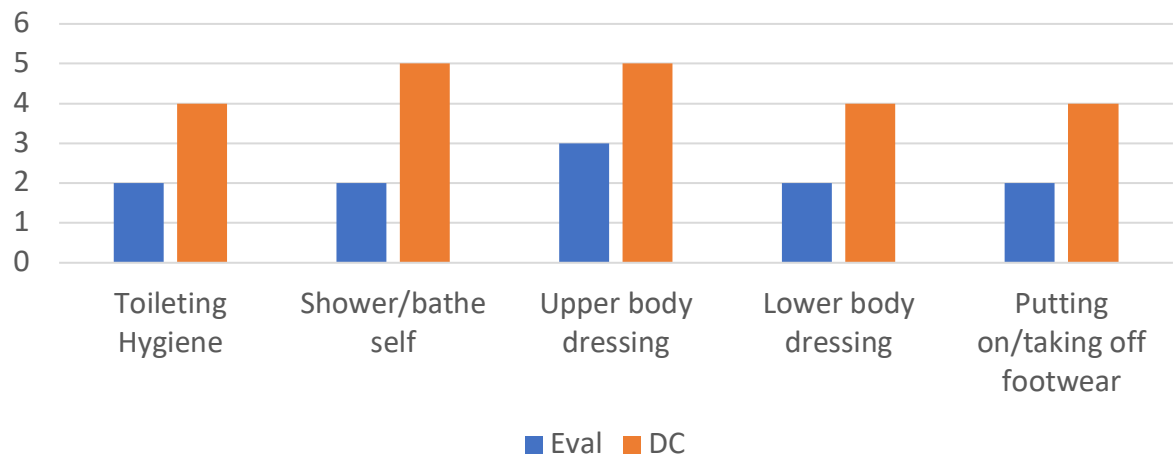
### **Outcomes:**

Determined to achieved her goal, Joy actively comes to the therapy gym on a daily basis. There were ups and downs on her journey but in the end she was able to walk 150FT with the use of the 2WW, was able to complete the stairs 4 times with emphasis on safety. Her family was glad to come and did the training and car transfer before she was discharge. Joy was very appreciative to all the therapists who worked with her in achieving her goals. She stated that she was taken cared of by the nursing and therapy department. Mission accomplished!

## Occupational Therapy



### 06 - Independent

Completes the activity by him/herself with no assistance from a helper

### 05 - Setup or clean-up assistance

Helper sets up or cleans up; patient completes activity. Helper assists only prior to or following the activity.

### 04 - Supervision or touching assistance

Helper provides verbal cues and/or touching/steadying and/or contact guard assistance as patient completes activity. Assistance may be provided throughout the activity or intermittently.

### 03 - Partial/moderate assistance

Helper does LESS THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts, holds, or supports trunk or limbs, but provides less than half the effort.

### 02 - Substantial/maximal assistance

Helper does MORE THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts or holds trunk or limbs and provides more than half the effort.

### 01 - Dependent

Helper does ALL of the effort. Patient does none of the effort to complete the activity. Or the assistance of 2 or more helpers is required for the patient to complete the activity.
